Welcome to Maryport Marina

We look forward to welcoming you and your crew to our Marina on the coast of West Cumbria, England. We aim to offer existing and new customers well maintained, clean and fully serviced pontoon berths for mooring your boat on the Solway coast. The hard standing storage is available throughout the year, for maintenance or storage of your boat. There are no restrictions for the length of time on the hard standing, if you wish your boat can be in storage for 6 months then you have that option.

New for this year is the Customer lounge, which we will endeavour to create a hub of activity. We hope that an Events Committee can be created to help the marina drive the activities forward. Although there will be no licenced bar, if you wish to bring your own drinks into the area, we have no objections. The area has a fridge, television, computer for searching the internet (not secure for personal data), laptop for accessing 'Visit My Harbours', cups, cutlery, microwave, wall kettle for hot drinks, book shelf to create a book swap, tables and chairs.

The Wi-Fi equipment has been changed this year, which we believe will help give a better signal to the pontoon system. Previously it has been difficult to get a signal on the hard standing, so it is hoped that this new equipment will give you Wi-Fi access.

Ideas and suggestions of a reasonable or sensible manner are always welcome, please contact a member of staff or send us a quick note with the details. Please remember we are here for your leisure time and if you wish to speak to the Staff or Operational Manager the reception door is always open. If you wish to speak to me, I am a little more difficult, but please make contact with the Administration staff and they will arrange time for me to speak to you at your convenience.

Arrangements for Berthing

Annual Berthing is only available with a signed Licence for one year, 1st April until 31st March, if you require an annual licence after the 1st April please contact the Administration Staff for options. The berthing arrangement is for a pontoon berth during the summer months and either a pontoon berth or storage ashore for the winter months (during the licence period we have no time limit restriction for your vessel being on the hard standing or any additional storage costs). If you cancel the Annual licence midterm, it will revert to the seasonal monthly changes.

Pontoon A south side has no electricity access and no access to the storage ashore (hard standing) it is offered to customers who have a boat with a maximum length of 6.5 metres, it is also a shallow area, therefore only shallow draught vessels will be allocated to certain berths, please contact the staff for details.

Summer Licence is for any month(s) between 1st April until 30th September for a pontoon berth or storage ashore.

Winter Licence is for any month(s) between 1st October until 31st March for a pontoon berth or storage ashore.

Weekly Leisure Berthing is for 7 nights for any leisure boat moored or stored ashore.

Daily Leisure Berthing is any leisure boat that comes through the marina entrance for 1 hour up to 24 hours and includes 3kWh of electricity.

Daily Commercial Berthing is for a commercial boat that comes through the marina entrance for 1 hour up to 24 hours, whether moored on the wall, pontoon or hard standing. If you wish to stay longer please contact the Administration staff for further details.

Payment for invoices

Invoices are due on receipt, we accept cash, debit card, credit card and if agreed bankers standing order over ten months.

Our Services

Slipway

The marina slipway is available for use by berth holders free of charge. The slipway is owned and used primarily by Maryport Marina for its 25 tonne lifting operations. Although our tenant, MPM Northwest occasionally uses the slipway for hauling out heavier vessels on their cradle. Therefore the use of the slipway must be co-ordinated through the marina office on 01900 814431.

Hard Standing Storage

The area is available for the storage and maintenance of your boat. We do not allow vehicles to be parked on the site, although in certain circumstances management may make allowances for exceptional reasons.

The Operational Staff take pride in ensuring the site is free from rubbish and debris, to assist them in the cleaning of the area, please do not leave paint tins, brushes, rubbish, fixings, wood, nails, etc in the hedges or underneath the boat. If you required a bin for general rubbish can provide just ask the staff. Also items should not be tied, locked or fastened to the fence, as this may damage the fence and increases the costs for the site.

Vessel Keys

We are happy to hold keys to your boat for emergency access purposes. However, we reserve the right to refuse keys for collection by third parties, unless prior written arrangements have been sent to this company. Any contractor wishing your keys must also have written permission.

Hoist

The 25 tonne self-powered slipway hoist is operated by our Operational Staff.

The maximum lifting limits of the hoist:

- Weight 25 tonnes, four lifting blocks are connected to the two slings, each pair of blocks have a maximum lifting capacity of 12 1/2 tonnes.
- Beam maximum 4.6 metres
- Draught will depend on the hull configuration, the maximum practical depth of the hoist is 2.6 metres
- Jib crane 1 tonne

Pump-Out Facility

A pump out station is located on the fuel pontoon and is available during daylight hours. Please contact the office to arrange this service and the operational will gladly assistance you at the location.

Fuel Berth

Red diesel is available at the end of pontoon A, which is our designated fuel berth. If you require fuel you will be required to complete and sign a duty declaration form. The Operational Staff will dispense fuel. All fuelling must take place from the designated fuel berth.

Petrol is available from the local petrol station, please ask staff for directions.

Payment For Service

Services are to be paid on the day of the service. VAT invoices will only be issued on request.

Reception and Access

The reception is open from 9:00 hours until 17:00 hours, Monday to Friday where you can speak to the Administration staff. During the summer season the Administration staff will be in the office Saturday and Sunday 9:30 – 16:30 hours.

Operational staff normally work 8:00 – 20:00 hours Monday to Sunday, although during the height of the summer season they will work until 23:00 hours. Outside of these hours, we operate the dock gate with staff coming to site 3 hours before high water and leave 3 hours after high water.

To contact the Operational Staff they will have the duty mobile, the number is **07422963278**. Please note that they may be on site dealing with requests from customers or opening/closing the dock gate.

Pedestrian Access is gained by using a fob to operate the gate entrance. A returnable deposit of £10.00 is required before a fob will be issued. A maximum of two fobs will be issued per boat. Berth holders and visitors can obtain a fob from the office at the time of registering their visit. The gate will open and close automatically when the fob is used. The gate lock can be operated from the office if necessary (when it is attended). Fobs issued to customers who have left the marina will result in the fobs being de-activated and the deposit being lost.

Parking

Car parking is near to the reception building and access to the pontoon system, which is free to all marina users. Limited secure parking within the compound is available for those leaving their vehicles for longer trips away or requiring access to the hard standing. Vehicles access is restricted to the site to ensure that customers' belongings are as secure as possible. We do however allow vehicles on the hard standing for loading and offloading, but under the supervision of the Operational staff. Occasionally contractors requiring specialist equipment may be allowed on site, without restrictions, but need written confirmation from Management.

Internet Access

Limited free Wi-Fi access is available within the Marina, please contact the staff for log-on details. A computer is available in the Customer Lounge for internet access, although it is not secure for use of personal confidential data.

Surveys

On occasion we may send out surveys asking for your view on certain areas. The feedback you give is extremely important to us and helps us to plan for the future and improve services.

Electricity and Water Connections

16 amp electricity sockets with smart meters are available on the pontoon berths, with the exception of the south side of Pier A. The electricity is accessed via a plastic cards system, where you can add and remove the kilowatts from the meter. We would appreciate you not using other marina cards on our system.

A minimum of two or three water stands are located on each pier.

Water and electricity are also available around the perimeter of the hard standing storage area. The electricity meters are still accessed via the paper cards bought from reception. Once the cards are inserted into the meter, the electricity is on the meter and we are unable to remove or transfer the excess.

Laundry

The laundry is open continuously. We have two large commercial washers, two large commercial dryers, and iron and iron board available. The equipment is operated by £1.00 and 20p coins. Soap powder can be purchased from the office. The average wash is £3.00 and the dryer is generally £2.40 for synthetics. On occasion we have found food stored in the cupboard, unfortunately this will be placed in the general refuse. Please contact the staff, if you require assistance.

Marina Gate

Marina Gate is a flap gate, which is operated when the water on the sill is registering 2.4 metres, the sill is 3.1 metres above Chart Datum. During the marina gate opening times the staff maintains a listening watch on Channel 12 and/or Channel 16.

All vessels are asked to call prior to entering or leaving the harbour. A traffic light system is in operation at the dock gate entrance. When the red 'traffic lights' are lit do not approach the entrance, but contact the Marina Staff via the VHF or mobile phone. During weekends the duty staff member can be contacted on the mobile telephone, the number is **07422963278**.

Mooring

Please ensure that your craft is correctly moored and fenders are secure at the appropriate heights, with proper bow and stern lines, and well placed springs. We cannot accept responsibility for any damages resulting from inadequate moorings and/or fenders, particularly during stormy conditions. Cleats provided on the pontoons are of cast quality and shackles should not be used to secure lines to the cleats. Marina staff walk the site to check the boats at least twice during daylight hours ensuring the boats are secure. We would however, always recommend the fitting of an alarm for reassurance ashore or afloat.

Sponsorship or Charitable Giving

Maryport Marina supports a number of charities locally, these include the Sea Cadets, Solway Adventurer Sailing Club and the Maryport Inshore Rescue Service. We also make donations to other worthy causes from time to time. If you are visiting Maryport on a sponsored voyage or passage and you require support, we would ask that you request this from us in advance, by written confirmation from your chosen charity that your request is valid. If you request support upon arrival or when settling your account on departure, this may well be declined. We cannot offer support in the form of fuel or electricity.

Residential mooring

We permit owners to live aboard with our prior written consent. If you use the marina address as your address for any official letters (NHS, Government etc.) this will be seen as living aboard your boat. Additional terms & conditions and a surcharge may apply.

Trolleys

These are provided for the convenience of all berth holders. They should be returned to the trolley park after use. Children should not 'ride' in trolleys. Please do not carry dirty fuel cans /oil containers / used fuel filters, etc. in trolleys.

Terms of Business

As a member of the Yacht Harbour Association and the British Marine Federation, we ensure that our Terms of Business are based on their issued guidelines. You can either download them from the internet, or ask the staff on reception for a copy. They are also issued with a Licence, whether it's for a new berth holder or an existing berth holder, we always issue a copy with a licence. They are subject to change and will be issued to all persons as and when changes occur.

As part of the Terms of Business and Licence, all Marina users are required to hold an insurance policy for the boat. Whether it's a fully comprehensive policy or a third party policy, it needs to be a minimum of £3 million. Marina users should satisfy themselves that they have taken all reasonable precautions to protect their property from third party inference.

Partnership Yacht Brokers

Maryport Marina works in alliance with Partnership Yacht Brokers, to ensure that a full brokerage service is available for customers.

Lavatories & Showers

Our facilities, both male and female are cleaned in-house by the male operational staff, a cleaning sign will be placed at the entrance. During cleaning the building will remain open, please proceed with caution. A separate facility is available for the less able and families which also includes a bath and baby changing facilities.

Heads and Bilges

We would appreciate you not flushing heads or emptying bilges in the Marina or Harbour, as this is not pleasant if anyone falls into the water or the environment.

Refuse

Domestic rubbish and the recycling facilities for glass bottles, paper, old batteries, and waste oil is provided at the end of the shower and toilet building. The waste oil facility is locked, please contact a member of staff to open the facility to place the oil in the tank. Please do NOT leave containers with substances, whether marked or unmarked on site, as this may be a hazard to human health and the potential to cause harm to vulnerable people. The Maryport Waste Management Plan is available for inspection if required.



Pets

Pets are welcome at the marina, but should be exercised off the site. Should your pet foul the area please ensure you clean up and prevent any annoyance to other Marina users. Dogs should be kept on a lead when not on board. We reserve the right to insist on appropriate pet insurance.
